Locke Lake News

Water Safety:

The lake association would appreciate it if members and guests would observe a counter-clockwise pattern when pulling tubers or skiers and also when making "laps" around the lake.

Please remember that you need to have a spotter in the boat on weekends and holidays when pulling tubers or skiers. This includes personal watercraft!

Fish and Wildlife Committee Update:

The commercial fisherman was out in late May and set some nets. The results of his take were less than encouraging as he only pulled 200 lbs of bullheads and a few big mouth buffalo fish out of the lake.

The DNR stocked the lake with 100,000 walleye fry this spring in their continuing effort to manage the walleyes in the lake. This year, the association has matched the efforts of the DNR with an additional 100,000 walleye fry.

Other committees:

We are in need of volunteers to help with the Education Committee, the Lake Improvement Committee, the Technical Committee and the Fish and Wildlife Committee. Please consider joining a committee in order to help us maintain the high quality of lake life we desire.

Lake Treatments:

We received the necessary responses from association members to extend our permit from the DNR to treat the lake for algae through 2011. Thank you!!!

<u>Curly Leaf:</u> Lake Management was out on May 13th to treat the lake in those areas where members had signed up. The curly leaf treatments do not appear to be as

effective this year as in some previous years. Dan has been in touch with Lake Management and they will be out to survey the lake and come back for a 2nd treatment if they feel it will be of benefit.

Lake Management has also told Dan that if the curly leaf continues to be resistant to current treatments we may need to try a pre-treatment of some sort to slow the growth of the curly leaf prior to actual treatment. If pre-treatment is necessary, there would likely be an increase in overall treatment fees payable to Lake Management.

Algae: We have not had to treat the lake for algae in the past 2 years. We believe one reason for this is the drive to get curly leaf out of the lake and let the native species start to re-establish.

Other items:

Remember to renew or obtain your <u>swim</u> <u>raft permit</u> from the Wright County Sheriff's Dept. Contact the records dept at 763-682-7622. Your permit number must be displayed on the raft and the raft must be reflectorized on all sides.
